1. DISCUSS THE MAJOR RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SARAKARIA COMMISSION ON CENTRE-STATE RELATIONS IN INDIA?

The R S Sarakaria Commission was appointed in 1983 as the first ever commission on centre-state relations in India. The recommendations of the Commission, submitted in 1986, have reshaped the sensitive centre-state relations in India to a large extent. The major recommendations of this commission are as follows. Establishment of a permanent Interstate Council Article 356 (President's Rule) should be used very sparingly Establishment of a permanent Interstate Council Article 356 (President's Rule) should be used very sparingly The institution of All-India Services should be further strengthened More All-India services should be created The residuary powers of taxation should continue to remain with the Parliament Deployment of armed forces by the Centre Consultation with the CM in the appointment of the Governor

The governor cannot dismiss the council of ministers so long as it commands a majority in the assembly
